The two Green-Winged Parrots (Sam and Polly) in the Terrace Aviary like to whistle and say 'Hello!

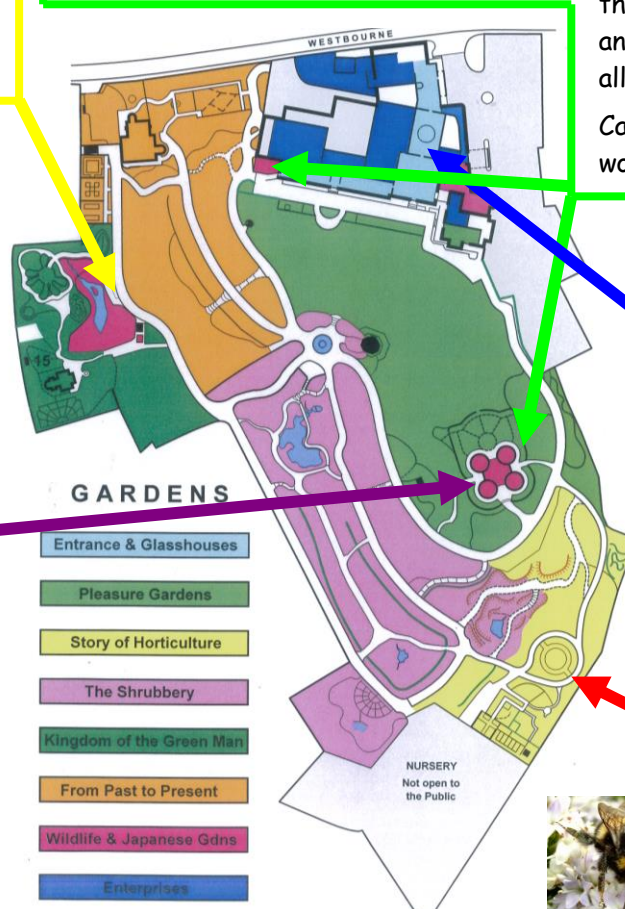
