Art Activities at Birmingham Botanical Gardens





Introduction

Many of the pupils using the Botanical Gardens for art work find it difficult to settle down because of the enormous amount and variety of material which can be used as starting points. In addition, they can find it difficult to focus on particular art skills such as the use of line or texture in their drawings.

The worksheets in this booklet are intended as 'warm-up' exercises to help pupils carefully observe what is around them and then collect a series of quick sketches based on a theme such as pattern or colour. These warm-up exercises can then lead on to more detailed studies which would take the pupils a longer time to complete.



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


