INTRODUCTION

Birmingham Botanical Gardens is an independent educational charity aiming to offer world class environmental education in a green environment to audiences in all sectors of the community.

ROLE PURPOSE

To assist in the routine maintenance and development of world class horticultural displays in the Gardens and Arboretum. In the long term, support the restoration of the Glasshouses and enjoyment of the gardens by the public.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Conduct routine tasks such as leaf raking, weeding, edging, mulching, cutting back, dead heading.
- 2. To follow the direction, training and supervision of Botanical Horticulturist and other staff in the maintenance and creation of displays in The Gardens from planting, cutting back, dead heading to weeding.

- 3. To ensure all BBG assets such as tools & plants are well looked after and maintained, that all BBG facilities are respected and kept tidy e.g., break areas, toilets.
- 4. To work independently and part as a team, towards the area management plan and in line with Living Collections Strategy, Health and Safety policy.

SUPERVISION

Working under the direction and/or supervision of Botanical Horticulturists and other more senior staff.

WORKING CONDITIONS

Manual handling, hot, humid, cold, small spaces, public areas. Back of house.

TIME COMMITMENT

Ideally once a week, Monday – Friday; 10.30-am 15.00pm. Minimum period of 6 months.
